



The Icelandic Canadian Club of British Columbia

SCHOLARSHIP FUND REGULATIONS

- 1) The Icelandic Canadian Club of British Columbia has established a fund to provide financial assistance to students of Icelandic origin who are residents of British Columbia and who are beginning or continuing a program of post-secondary education in British Columbia.
- 2) The scholarship committee shall endeavour to award a minimum of two scholarships each year for an amount determined by the Scholarship Committee. Additional awards may be considered and authorized by the Committee from time to time.
- 3) The details of the possible scholarships are as follows:
 - a) The **B.T.H. Marteinson Memorial Scholarship** is aimed at students in Health related fields : medicine, nursing, nuclear medicine, physiotherapy, radiotherapy, etc.. This award is given in the memory of the late Dr. B.T.H. Marteinson, a well known and respected member of the medical profession.
 - b) The **Anne Eyford Memorial Scholarship** is to be awarded at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee to a student in the Fine Arts field. This award is given in memory of Anne Eyford, a well known and respected member in the Icelandic Community in Vancouver.
 - c) The **Anna B. Nash Memorial Scholarship**, created in 1987, is to be awarded at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee to a student in Education studies. Students who are enrolled in undergraduate studies will be considered. The award is named in the memory of a respected teacher and member of the Icelandic Canadian community in Vancouver who died in 1986.
 - d) The **Thordarson Scholarship** was established in 1995 by the family of Theodore and Sigríður Thordarson in honour of their parents and their sister Helga. The scholarship will be awarded from the proceeds of the capital at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee for a student or students enrolled in the study of Health, Law or Education.
 - e) The **Warren Oddsson Memorial Scholarship** was established in 2002 by Art and June Oddsson in honour of their son Warren. The scholarship will be awarded from the proceeds of the capital at the discretion of the Scholarship Committee for a student enrolled in the study of Fine Arts, History or Humanities.
4. These awards are tenable at recognized post-secondary educational institutions for both academic and technical studies.

5) Academic Qualifications:

University Entrance Scholarships

Applicant must have successfully completed the following nine subjects and obtained a minimum (75%) B- average.

- English 11 & 12
- Social Studies 11
- Math 11
- Second Language 11
- Science 11 (one of Bi, Ch, Ph, ESc, CSc)
- Three other Grade 12 Academic subjects

The average shall be calculated on English 12, the best three Gr. 12 academic subjects, Math 11 and the best three Gr. 11 subjects from the above list.

Applicant must have been accepted in a British Columbia College or University for the next term.

Technical Studies Entrance Scholarships

Applicant must have successfully completed the following six subjects and obtained a minimum (67%) C+ average.

- English 12 (C+ min.)
- Math 11 (C+ min.)
- Science 11 (one of Ph, Ch, ESc, Bi, Sc&Tec, CompSt)
- Three other Grade 12 subjects.

The average shall be calculated on all six of the above subjects.

Applicant must have been accepted at a British Columbia Technical Institute for the next term.

Undergraduate Studies Scholarship

All applicants must be full time students at a British Columbia College or University.

(i.e., taking at least four full time subjects.)

Grade point average shall be converted to a percentage which must be at least 75% to qualify for an award.

6) These awards shall be made on the recommendation of a Scholarship Committee whose members shall be selected by the supporting organization.

7) Applicant must have a minimum of one grandparent of Icelandic descent or, failing that, a parent(natural or adopted) or grandparent that is a member of the Icelandic Canadian Club of B.C.

8) Applicants may be awarded only two scholarships in their lifetime regardless of the category.

9) These awards shall be known as the **Icelandic Canadian Club of British Columbia Scholarships.**

Please note that Entrance Awards are for students who are applying for funding for their first year of academic or technical studies; Undergraduate Awards refer to students applying for funds in the second year or more of their studies. Graduate awards refer to students who are in Masters or Doctoral studies.
